2012 PEBTF Open Enrollment / October 1 – October 19

Each fall, Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education employees (PASSHE) who are covered by Pennsylvania Employees Benefit Trust Fund (PEBTF) health benefits have an opportunity to review their coverage and make changes for the coming year. This year's open enrollment period is October 1 – October 19. All changes must be completed in Employee Self Service (ESS) or returned to the university human resources office no later than October 19. All changes made will become effective January 1, 2013.
