A Note from President Marcia G. Welsh. Ph.D. - In a letter dated November 16, 2012, the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) reaffirmed East Stroudsburg University of Pennsylvania's accreditation while requesting a monitoring report due September 1, 2013. The report is to document ESU's further implementation of an organized and sustained assessment process to evaluate and improve student learning, in all programs including general education, with evidence that assessment results are used to improve teaching and learning and to inform planning and resource allocation. Essentially, we need to show how we use assessment results to continuously improve student learning, i.e., evidence-based decision making.
